Snapshot

This project will examine collaborative urban planning processes to identify their strengths and weaknesses, and the barriers and opportunities for carbon reduction across Australia. The research will draw on the knowledge of key stakeholders in the Australian urban development industry, and it will work with CRC Participants to identify suitable pilot projects with high impact potential.

Outcome

This will provide a starting point to develop a more innovative vision for collaborative urban development planning in Australia, and how carbon reduction objectives can be locked in at through the planning process. This research project will provide a broad framework and starting point for subsequent CRC research in the area of collaborative urban development planning for low carbon living.
